The goal was to take the Pacific fleet out of action for at least six months. built and studied. Yamamoto ran drills in a shallow harbor in Japan to prepare for the strike. A fleet of Japanese submarines headed toward Hawaii in mid-November. A fleet of more than 30 warships left Japan on November 26. Six aircraft carriers transported hundreds of torpedo

planes, bombers, and fighter planes. They dropped anchor around 274 miles (440 km) from Pearl Harbor. SURPRISE

December 7, 1941, began like any normal Sunday at the Pearl Harbor December 7, 1941, begun nike any normal Sunday of the Fear France naval base. Around 7:55 a.m., Americans noticed planes flying in the navar base. Around 7:55 a.m., Americans noticed planes trying in the distance but figured it was just a training drill since the United States was not at war. As the planes approached, they saw the Rising Sun on the sides of the planes and knew it was not a drill.

The sky above Pearl Harbor was suddenly filled with Japanese aircraft. Dive bombers began dropping bombs on the unsuspecting crews. Many sailors were still asleep and guickly woke to get to their posts. The ships were closely packed together in plain sight, leaving the men trapped with no escape. Huge, powerful American

battleships filled with people and weapons were targeted first. Japan bombarded the battleships with underwater missiles dropped from torpedo planes. Fighter planes were used to destroy American aircraft before they could take off. American sailors acted quickly and began to fight back about five minutes into the attack. They tried to shoot down the Japanese planes with anti-aircraft guns. A handful of American fighter pilots reached their planes and took off, shooting down a few enemy aircraft. They were greatly outnumbered by the Japanese though

#### DAMAGE

A battleship called the USS Arizona was hit hard at 8:10 a.m. A heavy bomb slammed through its deck and into its magazine, where over a million pounds of explosives were stored. The ship burst into a giant ball of flames. It surk less than ten minutes after it was hit. Nearly 1,200 officers and crewmen were killed. The USS Oklahoma was hit by torpedoes early in the attack. Some men were able to abandon the ship and climbed onto the nearby USS Maryland to defend the harbor. The USS Oklahoma capsized, or tipped over, just 12 minutes after it was hit. Many men were trapped inside. Some were rescued, but many were not

### SECOND STRIKE

There was a break in the bombing around 8:40 a.m. before the Japanese aircraft came back. Some planes bombarded the ships that were already in trouble. Others targeted cruisers, destroyers, and other warships that had not been attacked during the first attack. Japanese dive bombers targeted the USS Nevada while it was trying to get away. It was hit by a torpedo and several bombs. The Americans beached the ship so it would not sink.







### MEMORIAL

A memorial was devoted to the U.S. soldiers who lost their lives in the attack at Pearl Harbor. It is known as the U.S.S. Arizona Memorial and was built on the water above the wreckage of the Arizona. considered a U.S. National Historic Landmark. Tt is
