

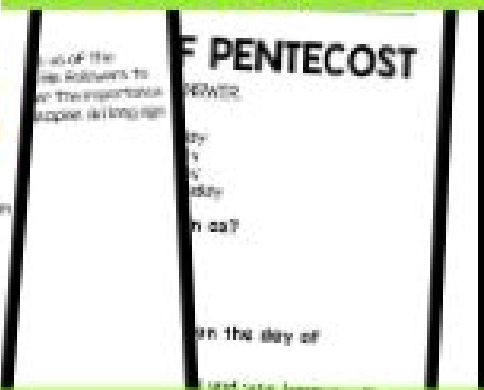
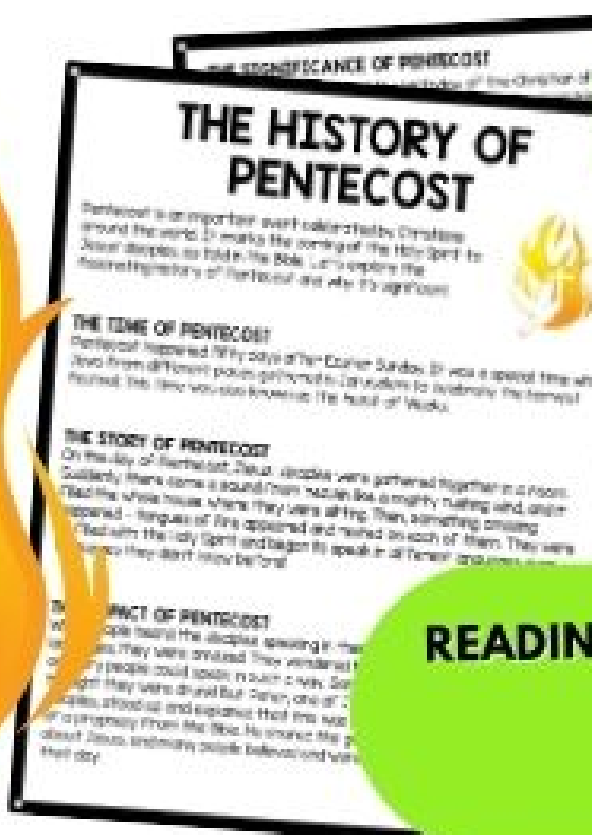

THE TIME OF PENTECOST

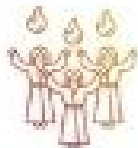
